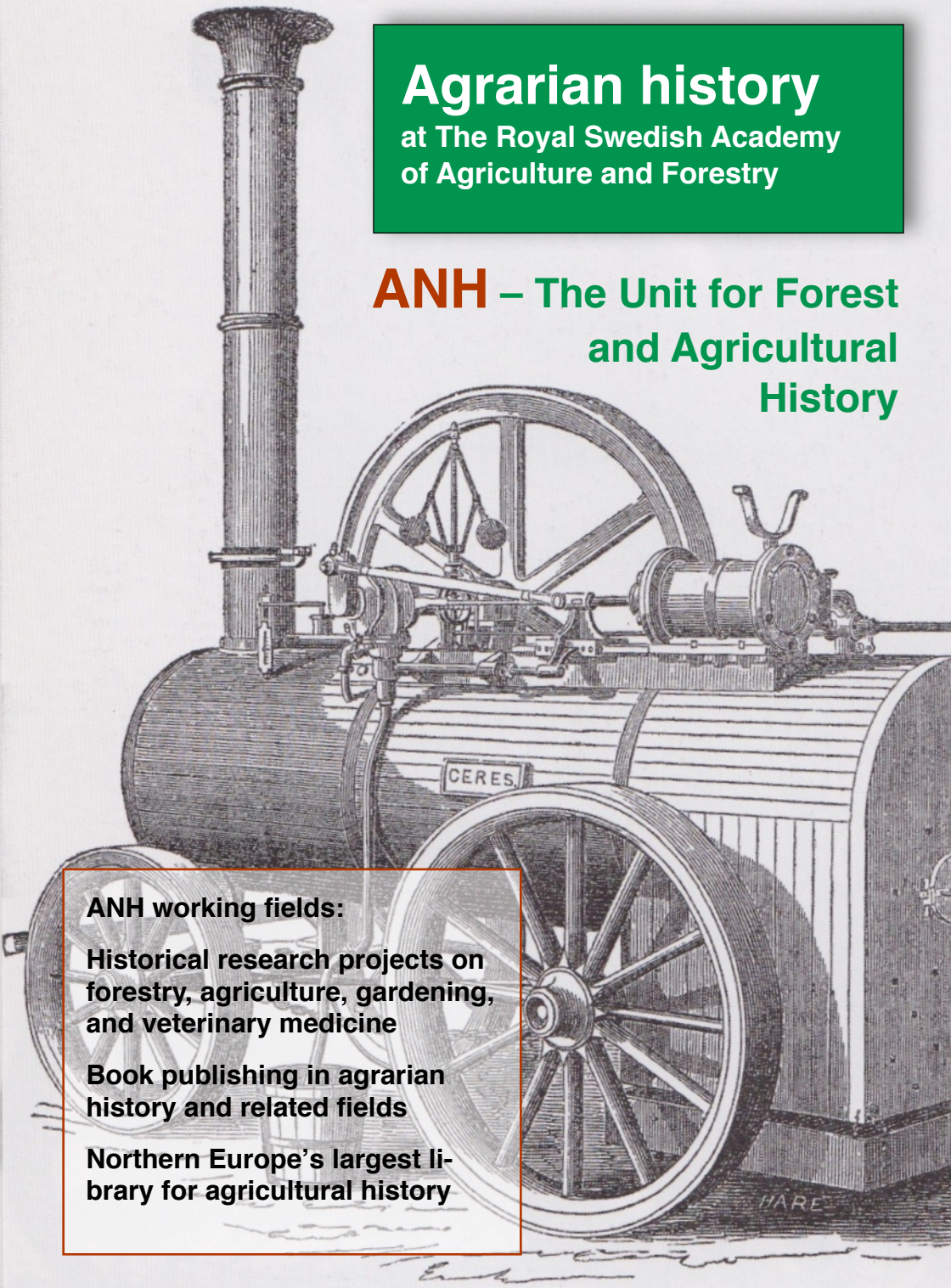

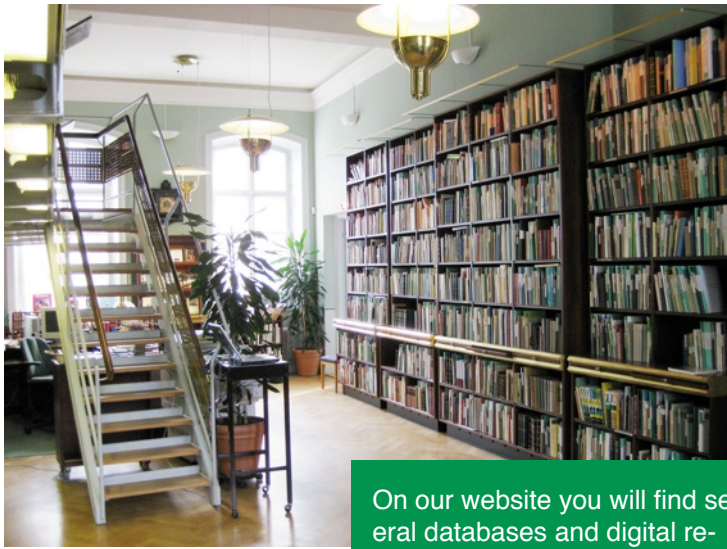

## *Library*



The Library of The Royal Swedish Academy of Agriculture and Forestry specialises in agricultural and forest history in a broad, interdisciplinary sense. The primary mission of the library is to serve the scientific community, including researchers and students, and the members of the Academy. The library is also open to the public. Books can be borrowed either by visiting the library or by interlibrary loan. International loans can also be arranged. For specific requests, please see contact information on the back of this flyer.

The collection contains 90,000 volumes. The majority of the collection is registered in LIBRIS, the joint catalogue of the Swedish academic research libraries (<http://libris.kb.se>). The library has two special collections: The older collection, consisting of books published before 1850, and an ethnobotanic collection, acquired in 2003 from the Danish ethnobotanic researcher Vagn J. Brøndegaard. The collection contains about 5000 volumes.

On our website you will find several databases and digital resources, mainly in Swedish. In English there is a database containing the abstracts (in pdf.) from 230 Swedish dissertations on agrarian subjects published between 1980 and 2007. ANH has the contact information to the authors.

The main focus of the collections is literature on the northern parts of Europe and North America, i.e., regions with similar natural conditions as Sweden.

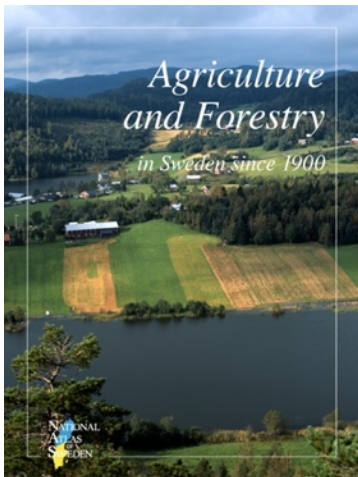
## *Projects and publishing*

ANH also runs several historical projects. The projects are lead primarily by historians of different disciplines together with the staff at ANH.

The projects have dual goals: To generate new research about Swedish agricultural history and to function as a

forum and platform for academic researchers to collaborate with people in the land-based industries. The historical projects stretch in subject from the development of veterinary science in Sweden to the use of maps in agrarian history research.

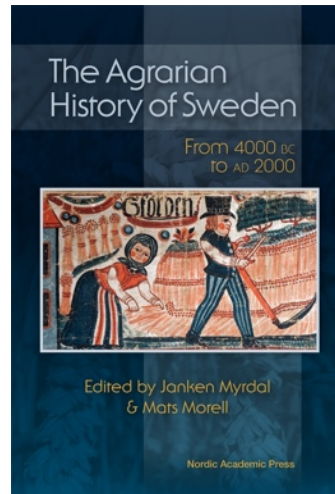
Projects are generally documented in the book series SOLMED (Skogs- och Lantbrukshistoriska meddelanden). From the start in 1992 over fifty vol-



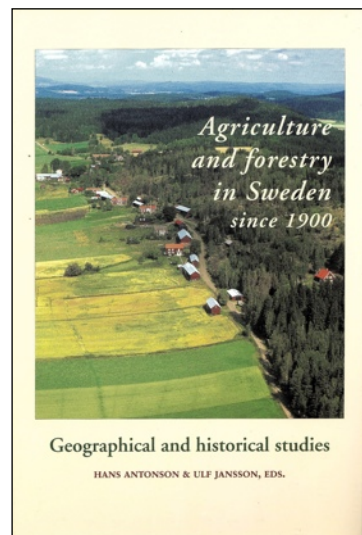
umes have been published.

A recent and large project have been about Swedish land use over the last century. It resulted in two separate volumes with editions in Swedish and English. The first volume, *Agriculture and forestry in Sweden since 1900 a cartographic description*, is published in the series National Atlas of Sweden. The second volume, *Agriculture and forestry in Sweden since 1900: geographical and historical studies*, is an in depth analysis on some central themes from the Atlas.

You have here the opportunity to buy, at a reduced price, books published in english over the years. The atlas and its



companion anthology, published by the Academy, but also books originated from different collaborations, for example with the section of Agrarian History at The Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences. Worth highlighting is *The Agrarian history of Sweden from 4000 BC to AD 2000*, edited by Janken Myrdal and Mats Morell.
